PRELUDE



Ybor City was born in the late 1800s, when cigar magnates brought thousands of Cuban, Spanish, and Italian workers to Tampa. Life centered around its grand social clubs—the Cuban, Italian, and Spanish clubs—which still stand today. These were places of music, theater, learning, and pride. But even here, Jim Crow cast its shadow: families divided, forced apart by the color of their skin.

Ybor was also a revolutionary hub. José Martí himself came here, rallying support for Cuba's independence. Tampa's cigars gained worldwide fame—so much so that Winston Churchill demanded his be rolled only by María Ferlita, known as Golden Hands. Inside the factories, cigar rolling was long and tedious. To pass the hours, workers listened to *lectores*—professional readers who stood above them, giving voice to novels, newspapers, even fiery speeches calling for change.

That culture began to crumble with mechanization.

At the same time, Prohibition opened the door to an underground world—speakeasies, rum-running, tunnels filled with secrets, and *bolita*, the illegal lottery. Into this world stepped Charles McKay Wall, known as Charlie Wall. Born on March 10th, 1880. A boy who shot his despised stepmother at 12, and then turned to the streets.

They called him *The White Shadow*. To some, a gangster. To others, a Robin Hood—slipping money to striking cigar workers in exchange for their votes. For decades, he ruled Tampa's underworld—*bolita*, bootlegging, even politics itself.

But power always invites rivals. From Sicily came Santo Trafficante. At first, an ally. Then, an adversary. Together, they moved in a delicate dance of loyalty and betrayal, ambition and blood.

And it is here, in the shadows of Ybor, that our story begins.



La Séptima: A **Gatsby Affair** was created out of a deep commitment to preserving and reimagining the cultural heritage of Ybor City through the transformative power of the arts. This multidisciplinary project integrates dance, visual arts, artificial intelligence video & imaging, live singing, and installations to tell the story of a resilient community rich with untold narratives.

La Séptima: A Gatsby Affair was not only developed to celebrate the history embedded in Ybor's streets but also to activate that history in a way that fosters connection, reflection, and imagination. For our audiences, it is more than just a performance; it becomes a shared experience of place, memory, and identity.


New Tampa Performing Arts Center


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
